## SECOND LEADERSHIP INSTITUTE FOCUSES ON WORK CULTURE



The Hall of Fame held its second annual Home Furnishings Leadership Institute for 25 emerging industry leaders Feb. 19-22 at High Point University.

Centered on the topic of building and protecting productive work cultures, the Institute included keynote interviews, interactive discussions and case study exercises. Three keynote sessions featured inducted members of

the American Home Furnishings Hall of Fame: Neil Goldberg, chairman of Raymour & Flanigan; Steve Pond, founder of Furniture Today; and Gordon Segal, co-founder of Crate and Barrel. A fourth session featured Caroline Hipple, president of Norwalk Furniture and co-author of A Pathway To Profit: Culture Impacts Performance.
